

INPUT REQUESTED: BIRD SCOOTERS IN DOWNTOWN

Bird Scooters has approached the City of Nampa with a request to enter into a Franchise Agreement to operate electric scooters throughout the city including Downtown. They would like to begin operations in May starting with 25 scooters and ramping up to 100+. Each scooter has GPS with technology to limit the areas where they operate and allows for restrictions on speed in certain areas. Initial feedback from the BID Board was to maintain the wheels free zone on sidewalks, require a phone number for complaints regarding location and hazards from scooters, 10mph maximum speed in downtown and potential parking corrals at Lloyd Square and Library Square. City Council would like to receive additional feedback from the Downtown Businesses regarding the potential of allowing e-scooters downtown. GET PREPARED to apply for the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF)

This funding will provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses that experienced loss during COVID-19.

How to prepare

Currently, SBA is not accepting applications for RRF. However, you can prepare your application by reviewing the sample application, program guide and cross-program eligibility chart on SBA COVID-19 relief options. You will be able to apply through SBA-recognized Point of Sale Restaurant Partners or directly via SBA in a forthcoming online application portal.

When to apply

The official application launch date will be announced shortly. Ahead of the application launch and over the next week, the SBA will establish a seven-day pilot period for the RRF application portal and conduct extensive outreach and training on how to apply, application requirements and where to apply. Participants in this pilot will be randomly selected from existing PPP borrowers in priority groups for RRF and will not receive funds until the application portal is open to the public. Following the pilot, the application portal will be opened to the public. For the first 21 days that the program is open, the SBA will prioritize reviewing applications from small businesses owned by women, veterans, and socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. Following the 21-day period, all eligible applicants are encouraged to submit applications.

Upcoming Downtown Projects

Two new Community Development Block Grant projects were approved by City Council for Downtown Nampa. The funding will provide for the design and engineering planning of Wall Street between 1st Street South and 2nd Street South. Plans for this area will transform the area into a more desirable, active and walkable access way, creating a pedestrian-only area, starting at 1st Street South and extending southward to 2nd St South. City Council also approved funding to replace outdated deteriorating sidewalk, curb, gutter, drainage facilities, and fire hydrants. This project will also address pedestrian safety and accessibility by updating the existing, non-compliant, ADA pedestrian ramps/crossings at the intersection of 1st Street South & 13th Avenue South. Construction will begin in fiscal year 2022.
